The Chester resident and owner of RBM Roofing and General Contracting, with offices in Chester and Randolph, is to be featured with his business on "Designing Spaces," a half-hour television program airing on TLC and WE networks.

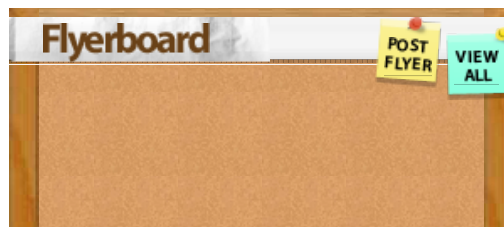

Morris County NJ roofer to appear on "Designing Spaces" TV show

Muller called the "Designing Spaces" taping "an exciting experience for me and my guys."

"Joanne Liebler (the show's host) is also an authority in construction," Muller said. "It was great to hear lots of positive comments about our cleanliness and speed on the job from the production team of the show."

Before the awards and TV appearance, Muller said it was "me and a Toyota pickup." That was back in 1990 when he started his business after graduating Parsippany Hills High School in 1986 and attending school to work as a builder.

"I swore to never be a roofer," Muller said. "My father was one, too. But I started and I enjoyed it. Now, my business is 95 percent roofing and 5 percent gutters and siding."

Muller saw his company grow in the 2000s. As he transitioned over the years, he began to see the correlation with crew size and quality. By 2007, he opted to downsize people and equipment. He now staffs just eight employees: six mechanics, one of which has been with RBM Roofing since it began, and two "ground guys" who clean up as a job goes on.

"Quality is most important for our clients," Muller said. "I'm 100 percent certain you'll never see a crew as clean as mine."

RBM Roofing gets started every day around 7:30 a.m., working on homes across Morris County, according to Muller. He now spends most of his time supervising projects, "lending a hand occasionally," and providing estimates.

"I'm up on the roof for every proposal we have," Muller said. "We can have 20 to 25 in a busy week. I've been on well over 10,000 roofs in my life — my first memory being with my dad at 5 years old."

As his Randolph job concluded, Muller pointed to his crew with a smile.

"Don't you just love these guys," Muller said. "We're not the biggest company, but we can usually do a roof a day. We won the GAF awards when a third-party inspector took a look at our work. Every roof was given a 10 out of 10."

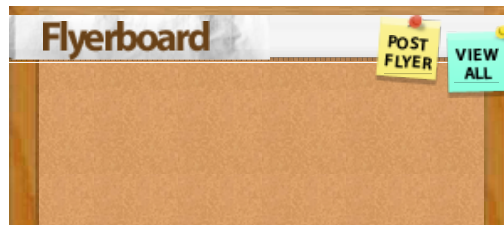
